Port of Skamania County Resolution No. 15-2020

A RESOLUTION of the Port of Skamania County authorizing electronic and digital signatures

WHEREAS, in RCW Ch. 19.360 the legislature has authorized the use of electronic signatures by Washington agencies; and

WHEREAS, in March 2020, through Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6028 ("ESSB 6028"), the Washington State Legislature repealed Chapter 19.360 RCW and adopted the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act, which is intended to facilitate use of electronic transactions consistent with other applicable law, and to bring consistency to reasonable practices concerning electronic transactions and with the continued expansion of those practices; and

WHEREAS, ESSB 6028 took effect on June 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, ESSB 6028 defines an "electronic signature" as "an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record"; and

WHEREAS, ESSB 6028 defines an "electronic record' as "a record created, generated, sent, communicated, received, or stored by electronic means"; and

WHEREAS, ESSB 6028 provides that "[a] record or signature may not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because it is in electronic form; a contract may not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because an electronic record was used in its formation; if a law requires a record to be in writing, an electronic record satisfies the law; and if a law requires a signature, an electronic signature satisfies the law"; and

WHEREAS, the method and process for electronic submissions and the use of electronic signatures must be established by ordinance, resolution, policy, or rule; and

WHEREAS, to promote social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic, and to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of the Port of Skamania County's business processes, the Port desires to leverage technology solutions which are in compliance with the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act to apply authenticated electronic signatures to legally enforceable electronic records as allowed by ESSB 6028.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated and fully made a part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The Board of Commissioners finds it to be in the public interest to allow the use of electronic records and electronic signatures for Port business to the fullest extent allowed by law.

Section 3. The Board of Commissioners hereby adopts the Electronic and Digital Signature Policy attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

Section 4. This resolution and policy shall take effect immediately

EXHIBIT A

Port of Skamania County Electronic Signatures Policy

TITLE: Electronic and Digital Signature Policy
EFFECTIVE DATE: Dec 15, 2020
APPROVED BY: Port Commission per Resolution 15-2030
ATTORNEY REVIEW: Completed by Kenneth B. Woodrich of Kenneth B Woodrich PC, 2020

State law has codified the authority to execute documents remotely. Streamlining processes that require wet signatures and replacing them with electronic signatures, when practicable, is consistent with the intent of State law to promote electronic transactions and remove barriers that might prevent the use of electronic transactions by governmental entities. By transitioning to a policy of executing documents remotely, the Port will reduce its reliance on paper-based transactions and will further improve information security and sharing. Further, such transition will facilitate more efficient approval of and access to documents and reduce costs and environmental impact.

PURPOSE: The intent of this policy is to establish a policy to allow for the acceptance and submission of electronic and digital signatures.

SCOPE: All Authorized Signers for the Port of Skamania County.

REFERENCES: ESSB 6028 codified at 19.360

DEFINITIONS: Authorized Signer: The Port Commissioners, the Port Executive Director, Port General Counsel, Mayor, Mayor Pro Tem, Department Directors, and their designees, and any other Port employee or elected official who has been granted authority to sign certain records on behalf of the Port either by the nature of their position in relation to the record or by direct authorization from Port Commission or Duvall Municipal Code.

Digital Signature: One type of electronic signature that contains a digital certificate, issued by a licensed certificate authority, behind the signature and offers authentication when sending a "signed" electronic document.

Electronic Record: A record created, generated, sent, communicated, received, or stored by electronic means

Electronic Signature: An electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record.

Facsimile Signature: A reproduction of a hand written signature that has been saved electronically or by engraving, imprinting or stamping.

Wet Signature: A standard pen-to-paper signature.

POLICY:

- 1. Pursuant to Resolution 15-2020, the Port authorizes electronic transactions and the use of electronic, digital, or facsimile signatures in accordance with this Policy
- 2. A Port document that is required by law to be signed in non-electronic media may not be electronically or digitally signed.
- 3. An electronic, digital or facsimile signature is an acceptable substitute for a wet signature on records requiring the signature of any record whenever the use of a wet signature is authorized or require, except as provided herein.
- 4. If an electronic or digital signature is used for interstate transactions or for documents required by the US Federal government, the signature shall comply with the requirements of the Electronic Signatures in Global and Electronic Commerce Act.
- 5. A document signed electronically, digitally or via facsimile shall be deemed the equivalent of an original signed document if the individual or entity signing the document has complied with the provisions of this Policy.
- 6. This Policy in no way affects the Port's ability to conduct a transaction using a physical medium and shall not be construed as a prohibition on the use of wet signatures.

PROCEDURE:

- A. Authorization for Use of Electronic Transactions and Electronic, Digital, and Facsimile Signatures
 - 1. Authorized Signers are authorized to sign records using a facsimile signature or via an electronic signature platform to affix electronic or digital signatures to Port records as provided in this Policy.
 - 2. Authorized Signers may affix electronic, digital, or facsimile signatures to the following records: Minutes of all Port Commission meetings, retreats, and workshops, Resolutions and Ordinances adopted by the Port Commission, Accounts Payable records (including but not limited to invoices, vouchers, and expenditure approvals), and any and all Contracts and Agreements to which the Port is a party.
 - 3. Electronic, digital or facsimile signatures may be used on Port records requiring execution by a third party.
- B. Security of Electronic Transactions and Electronic, Digital, and Facsimile Signatures
 - a) A valid digital signature that is issued by a certificate authority provides the following protections:
 - i) Verifies the Authorized Signer is who they represent themselves to be because the person had to prove their identity to a certificate authority to obtain the digital signature.
 - ii) Confirms the signature was applied to the document and not copied from another document because the signature file is cryptographically bound to the document.
 - iii) Ensures the document was not altered after it was signed.
 - b) The private key used to create a digital signature is the personal property of the subscriber and is

exempt from public inspection and copying under Chapter 42.56 RCW.

- Authorized Signers may sign Port documents digitally if such an option is available, providing the following:
 - i) The digital certificate utilized by the Authorized Signer in connection with the digital signature is obtained from a certification authority in compliance with state law:
 - ii) The digital certificate is not expired when the Authorized Signer signs the document digitally;
 - iii) The Authorized Signer does not provide information to the certification authority they know to be untrue; and
 - iv) The digital signature contains the following information:
 - (1) A hand-written representation of the Authorized Signer's signature;
 - (2) A typed representation of the Authorized Signer's name and title; and
 - (3) The date and time of the signature.
- 3) Electronic or digital signatures cannot be applied using Authorized Signer's name. Records signed by an Authorized Signer shall use their own electronic or digital signature.
- 4) Authorization to use or accept facsimile signatures shall be limited to instances where the authenticity of the signatures is deemed reliable and secure. In order to accept a facsimile signature in lieu of a wet signature, the authenticity of the facsimile signature must be verified by the receiving party. Such means of verification may include:
 - i) The receipt of a faxed signature from a facsimile number verified as belonging to or traceable to the party that did so sign and transmit the document.
 - ii) The receipt of an emailed signature from an email address verified as belonging to the party that did so sign and transmit the document.
- 5) Information that is necessary to verify the authenticity of a facsimile signature should be retained and transmitted to the Port Clerk with the document. This retained information may include but it is not limited to an electronic file with metadata saved from an email to which a facsimile signature was attached or a fax coversheet verifying who sent the record.
- C. Transmission and Storage of Electronic Transactions and Signatures
 - 1. Electronically or digitally signed electronic records shall be stored in such a way as to ensure their preservation, disposition, integrity, security, confidentiality, and auditability.
 - 2. Electronic records shall only be transmitted via secure services including, but not limited to, email, drop box, and cloud-based digital signature platforms.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-2020

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING PROPOSED REVISIONS TO THE COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE MANAGEMENT PLAN POLICIES FOR URBAN AREA BOUNDARY REVISIONS

WHEREAS, in 1986, Congress passed the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area Act, Pub. L. 99–663, §§ 2–18, 100 Stat. 4274 (1986), now codified at 16 U.S.C. §§ 544–544p ("Act"). The Act created the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area ("NSA") and designated 13 Urban Areas within the NSA.

WHEREAS, the Act states two purposes: (1) to create a national scenic area in Washington and Oregon "to protect and provide for the enhancement of the scenic, cultural, recreational, and natural resources of the Columbia River Gorge"; and (2) to protect and support the economy of the area "by encouraging growth to occur in existing urban areas and by allowing future economic development in a manner that is consistent with" the first purpose.

WHEREAS, the Columbia River Gorge Commission ("Gorge Commission") adopted the Columbia River Gorge Management Plan ("Management Plan") in 1991 and the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture concurred with the Management Plan in 1992.

WHEREAS, Congress directed the Gorge Commission to review the Management Plan no sooner than 5 years but at least every 10 years to determine whether it should be revised. The Gorge Commission last adopted revisions to the Management Plan in 2004.

WHEREAS, in 2016, the Gorge Commission and U.S. Forest Service began to work on a second revision to the Management Plan and propose to adopt revisions to the Management Plan in 2020.

WHEREAS, the Gorge Commission proposes significant policy changes as a part of the proposed 2020 amendments to the Management Plan that undercut the purpose of the Act to protect and support the economy of the area and effectively prohibit any future growth in the Urban Areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Port of Skamania the proposed 2020 amendments to the Management Plan that fail to protect and support the economic vitality of The Gorge. The proposed revisions to Part IV Administration, Chapter 1 Gorge Commission Role, Revision of Urban Area Boundaries are inconsistent with the Act and preclude future growth opportunities for the Gorge's Urban Areas.

A RESOLUTION OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY COMMISSION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO PROVIDE RENT RELIEF IN RESPONSE TO THE OUTBREAK OF COVID-19

WHEREAS, COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death to vulnerable or at-risk populations, is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which is a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person; and

WHEREAS, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") identifies the potential public health threat posed by COVID-19 both globally and in the United States as "high", and has advised that person-to-person spread of COVID-19 will continue to occur globally, including within the United States; and

WHEREAS, On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for COVID-19, beginning on January 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, Governor Jay Inslee proclaimed a state of emergency within the State of Washington due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020, Governor Inslee signed Proclamation 20-25, the "Stay Home -- Stay Healthy" Proclamation, ordering all citizens to stay home and closing all but enumerated "essential businesses", initially through April 6, 2020, and extended by Proclamation 20-25 through May 4th, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, the Port of Skamania County Board of Commissioners Authorized Emergency Powers to the Executive Director in response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Port tenants contribute significantly to the Skamania County economy and employment, and the COVID-19 emergency has adversely affected those tenants; and

WHEREAS, the Commission recognizes the hardship created by the emergency, and wishes to provide rent relief during this period to avoid economic hardship and business failures resulting from the emergency.

WHEREAS, the Commission further observes businesses may apply and qualify for government loans under the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) or the Paycheck Protection Program Loan (PPPL), some of which may be forgiven, to pay businesses' monthly rent, and those tenants who receive those payments should not be allowed rent relief if that rent is being subsidized by the American taxpayers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- A. The Port Commission authorizes the Executive Director to provide rent relief to Port tenants as follows:
 - i. Reducing rent to one-half the lease rate from April 1, 2020 until the Governor's "Stay Home -- Stay Healthy" period ends. During this period, Leasehold tax shall be reduced to be based on the one-half lease rate to reflect the lease value is reduced due to the tenants' inability to conduct business on the leased premises during the emergency.
 - ii. Allowing Tenants to defer payment of rent accruing during this period without penalty or late fees, provided any Tenant deferring rent shall agree to pay the deferred rent over a period on not more than twelve (12) months in equal installments. Deferred rent shall be payable in addition to regular rent, commencing with the resumption of regular rent payments. If timely paid, deferred rent shall not accrue interest.
 - iii. Provided, however, where the tenant has applied for and received funds under a COVID-19 relief program for rent payments such as the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) or the Paycheck Protection Program Loan (PPPL), this rent relief program will not apply for any periods included in that program.
 - iv. To qualify for the rent relief set forth herein, any tenant seeking that relief must first apply to the Executive Director to participate in this program and must include a description of all programs applied for that include rent subsidies.
 - v. Including such other terms as the Executive Director deems to be in the Port's and public's best interests.
- B. This Resolution shall take effect immediately and be in full force and effect for the same time period, and without action required to renew, as the "Stay Home Stay Healthy" period is extended.

WHEREAS, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") identifies the potential public health threat posed by COVID-19 both globally and in the United States as "high", and has advised that person-to-person spread of COVID-19 will continue to occur globally, including within the United States; and

WHEREAS, On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for COVID-19, beginning on January 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, Governor Jay Inslee proclaimed a state of emergency within the State of Washington due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the Skamania County Board of County Commissioners proclaimed a state of emergency within Skamania County due to COVID-19 and the State of Washington has instituted mandatory social distancing measures to prevent local spread of the illness.

- B. The Port Executive Director is authorized to make and adjust Human Resources Policies related to leave usage and other issues related to Port employees as necessitated by the impacts of COVID-19.
- C. The Port Executive Director may make temporary (up to one year or the duration of the emergency) appointments of personnel to positions that directly respond to the emergency, when the urgency of filling positions prohibits examining applicants through the competitive process, and is immediately necessary for the protection of life and property.

- D. Pursuant to RCW 42.30.070, and the state of emergency, urgent meetings of the Port Commission where public meeting requirements are impractical are exempt from the meeting notice requirements and meeting location restrictions of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 42.30 RCW.
- E. The Port Commission further reserves its right to issue such further orders as may be necessary to respond to the state of emergency declared by Skamania County, the State of Washington, or the United States in response to COVID-19.
- F. This Resolution shall take effect immediately and be in full force and effect for the same time period, and without action required to renew, as the state of emergency adopted by the Skamania County Commissioners.

WHEREAS, the dams on the Columbia and Snake Rivers provide navigable waters to sustain the region's marine-dependent economy, irrigation, flood control and recreation for the residents of Washington state and the Pacific Northwest; and

WHEREAS, the Port of **PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY** handles cargo shipped on the Federal Columbia-Snake River System ("FCSRS") and exports that cargo globally;

WHEREAS, the Lower Snake River Dams enable irrigation for over 7 million acres of farmland producing \$8 billion in agricultural income; and

WHEREAS, the Lower Snake River Dams enabled barging of approximately 9 million tons of cargo in 2014 valued at over \$3 billion; and

WHEREAS, the FCSRS is the top wheat export gateway in the U.S. handling over half of the country's exported wheat from 11 U.S. states, is the second most important export system in the U.S. for corn and soybeans, and is the west coast's largest export system for wood products and minerals; and

WHEREAS, the 465-mile federal waterway provides access to internal markets for Washington state farmers and farmers as far as the Midwest; and

WHEREAS, over 3.5 million tons of cargo were barged on 244 four-barge tows on the Snake River in 2017, a year when the locks were closed for three months for maintenance. In comparison, it would have taken over 35,140 rail cars or 135,000 semi-trucks to carry this same cargo; and

WHEREAS, annually the river cruise boat industry brings approximately 30,000 passengers and crew up the Columbia River to the Snake River, providing once-in-a-lifetime personal experiences and creating a positive economic impact to the region; and

WHEREAS, high-technology firms have located facilities in **PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY**, Stevenson WA and throughout the Pacific Northwest because of the availability of reliable, carbon-free hydropower, creating jobs and boosting local economies; and

WHEREAS, the federal agencies responsible for the management of the Federal Columbia River Power System (FCRPS) (Bonneville Power Administration (BPA), Army Corps of Engineers, Bureau of Reclamation) operate the dams in compliance with the Biological Opinions (BiOps) approved by the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Fisheries in 2008/2010 (as supplemented in 2014), and in 2019; and

WHEREAS, BPA has spent nearly \$17 billion on infrastructure and fish mitigation projects since 1978 including projects that address hydroelectric operations, habitat, hatcheries and harvest; and

WHEREAS, those investments, made in accordance with Biological Opinions approved by NOAA Fisheries, have successfully improved fish runs resulting in greater than 96% of young salmon making it past each

of the dams on their down river passage; and

WHEREAS, in 2014, there were more chinook, sockeye, and coho salmon that returned to Bonneville Dam than any year since the dam was built in 1938; and

WHEREAS, reports from NOAA Fisheries indicate that Columbia/Snake River chinook salmon returns increased in 2018; and

WHEREAS, while 2017 and 2018 saw significant declines in overall salmon returns, studies by NOAA Fisheries have attributed those declines to ocean conditions that are expected to dissipate by 2020, leading experts to forecast improved overall salmon returns in that year;

WHEREAS, the most recent Washington State budget set aside \$750,000 to study the economic and social impacts of the potential breaching or removal of the Lower Snake River Dams and the proposed study duplicates a more comprehensive effort that is several years underway by the federal agencies in the Columbia River Systems Operations Environmental Impact Statement (CRSO EIS) process.

WHEREAS, the FCRPS has been, is and will continue to be a critical component of life in the Pacific Northwest; and

WHEREAS, the 31 federal dams on the Columbia and Snake Rivers provide a reliable source of clean energy for millions of residents of Washington state and the Pacific Northwest; and

WHEREAS, the Lower Snake River Dams annually produce 1,000 aMW of carbon free power, enough to serve nearly half a million Northwest businesses, industries and households; and

WHEREAS, the BPA has identified the Lower Snake River Dams as critical components of the FCRPS mission of supporting peak power generation; and

WHEREAS, the Lower Snake River Dams are some of the least expensive to operate and, with the cost of power generated by the dams ranging from \$10 to \$14 per megawatt-hour, provide some of the greatest value for BPA customers; and

WHEREAS, removing over 2,000 megawatts of firm winter capacity generated by the Lower Snake River Dams would add to a forecasted Northwest shortfall in energy capacity; and

WHEREAS, the hydro system is in large part responsible for the clean air, water and lands enjoyed by millions in the Pacific Northwest; and

WHEREAS, the State of Washington has passed legislation calling for 100% of all retail energy sales to come from carbon free resources by 2045; and

WHEREAS, the passage of Substitute Senate Bill 5116 included existing hydropower as an eligible resource for utilities seeking compliance with the 100% clean requirement; and

WHEREAS, the Energy & Environmental Economics (E3) study has found that the cost of achieving 100% clean energy "leads to exponential cost increases and is impractical due to massive renewable overbuilds"; and

WHEREAS, the clean and renewable energy generated by the hydro system has made Washington state a national and world leader in responsible environmental stewardship; and

WHEREAS, the removal of the four Lower Snake River Dams would do irreparable damage to Washington and the Pacific Northwest's role as a leader in clean, carbon free energy production;

NOWTHEREFORE, the Port Commission of **PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY** does hereby resolve as follows:

The **Port of SKAMANIAN COUNTY** supports the continued operation of the dams within the Federal Columbia-Snake River System due to their importance to irrigation, flood control, recreation, fuel-efficient, safe, low-emission cargo transportation, and reliability of the Northwest electric grid as well as for the carbon-free, renewable, reliable, and low-cost energy they provide making them an important component of a clean energy future.

Based on studies and BiOps carried out by NOAA Fisheries, the Commission endorses the position that hydroelectric dams and salmon can coexist.

Given that the CRSO EIS process is well-underway and expected to be concluded in 2020, the Commission believes the \$750,000 allocated to study the impacts of the removal of the Lower Snake River Dams to be duplicative and wasteful and should have been allocated to science-based, high-priority salmon restoration projects in the Puget Sound region that will have a direct impact on Orca survival in their primary habitat.

The **Port of SKAMANIA COUNTY** will continue to provide resources toward educating others as to the benefits of the entire Columbia and Snake River System, and of the threats posed to salmon runs by factors such as lost habitat, predation and ocean conditions.

The foregoing Resolution of the **Port of SKAMANIA COUNTY** was duly adopted by its Board of Commissioners at its meeting of the 21st day of January, 2020.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY AUTHORIZING THE PORT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO SELL AND CONVEY SURPLUS PROPERTY WITH LESS THAN \$10,000 VALUE

WHEREAS, from time to time it is necessary to surplus items no longer needed for Port District purposes, and;

WHEREAS; RCW 53.08.090 provides that the Port Commissioners may authorize the Port Executive Director to sell and convey property of less than \$10,000 in value;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Commissioners of the Port of Skamania County as follows:

<u>Section 1</u> The Executive Director is authorized pursuant to RCW 53.08.090, to sell and convey surplus Port District property having a value of less than \$10,000.

<u>Section 2</u> Prior to the sale or conveyance of property pursuant to this resolution, the Executive Director shall compile an itemized list of the property to be sold, together with the value placed on each item by the Executive Director. The list shall be submitted to the Port Commission, together with the Executive Director's written certification that the listed property is no longer needed for the Port District purposes.

<u>Section 3</u> The Executive Director shall determine the methods, terms and conditions of sales made pursuant to this resolution. When less than the full purchase price is paid at the time of purchase, the sale shall comply with the limitations of RCW 53.08.091.

<u>Section 4</u> Except as provided above, all sales made pursuant to this resolution shall be by public competitive sale, through open auction or sealed bids or in another commercially reasonable way (e.g. best offer after newspaper ad, Craigslist posting, eBay listing, etc.). The sale shall be advertised by the Executive Director at least fourteen (14) days prior to its occurrence.

<u>Section 5</u> Property having a value in excess of \$10,000.00 shall not be divided into components of less than \$10,000 and sold pursuant to this resolution, unless the sale is authorized by the Commission and is by public competitive bid.

Section 6 This resolution shall be in force for the 2020 calendar year and shall expire on December 31, 2020.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY SETTING PORT COMMISSIONER COMPENSATION

WHEREAS, the Port of Skamania County Board of Commissioners is a municipal corporation of the State of Washington; and

WHEREAS, the Port of Skamania County is governed by the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) Title 53 for Port Districts; and

WHEREAS, the RCW 53.12.260(2) Port commissioners shall receive additional compensation as follows: (a) Each commissioner of a port district with gross operating revenues of twenty-five million dollars or more in the preceding calendar year shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars per month, as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management in subsection (4) of this section; and (b) each commissioner of a port district with gross operating revenues of from one million dollars to less than twenty-five million dollars in the preceding calendar year shall receive a salary of two hundred dollars per month, as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management in subsection (4) of this section. ("...[4] The dollar thresholds for salaries and per diem compensation established in this section must be adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management every five years, beginning July 1, 2008, based upon changes in the consumer price index during that time period. 'Consumer price index' means, for any calendar year, that year's annual average consumer price index, for Washington state, for wage earners and clerical workers, all items, compiled by the bureau of labor and statistics, United States department of labor. If the bureau of labor and statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas within the state, the index covering the greatest number of people, covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and including all items shall be used for the adjustments for inflation in this section. The office of financial management must calculate the new dollar threshold and transmit it to the office of the code reviser for publication in the Washington State Register at least one month before the new dollar threshold is to take effect.); and

WHEREAS, the Port of Skamania County's gross operating revenue, as defined by RCW 53.12.005, for the year ended December 31, 2019 was over one million dollars; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Skamania County that, in addition to any per diem compensation allowed, the Port of Skamania County pay the Port Commissioners the \$285 per month salary on the first Staff Pay Day of each month during 2020.
