WHEREAS, the RCW 53.12.260(2) Port commissioners shall receive additional compensation as follows: (a) Each commissioner of a port district with gross operating revenues of twenty-five million dollars or more in the preceding calendar year shall receive a salary of five hundred dollars per month, as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management in subsection (4) of this section; and (b) each commissioner of a port district with gross operating revenues of from one million dollars to less than twenty-five million dollars in the preceding calendar year shall receive a salary of two hundred dollars per month, as adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management in subsection (4) of this section. ("...[4] The dollar thresholds for salaries and per diem compensation established in this section must be adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management every five years, beginning July 1, 2008, based upon changes in the consumer price index during that time period. 'Consumer price index' means, for any calendar year, that year's annual average consumer price index, for Washington state, for wage earners and clerical workers, all items, compiled by the bureau of labor and statistics, United States department of labor. If the bureau of labor and statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas within the state, the index covering the greatest number of people, covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and including all items shall be used for the adjustments for inflation in this section. The office of financial management must calculate the new dollar threshold and transmit it to the office of the code reviser for publication in the Washington State Register at least one month before the new dollar threshold is to take effect.); and

WHEREAS, the Port of Skamania County's gross operating revenue, as defined by RCW 53.12.005, for the year ended December 31, 2016 was over one million dollars; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Skamania County that, in addition to any per diem compensation allowed, the Port of Skamania County pay the Port Commissioners the \$254 per month salary on the first Staff Pay Day of each month during 2017.

<u>Section 3</u> The Executive Director shall determine the methods, terms and conditions of sales made pursuant to this resolution. When less than the full purchase price is paid at the time of purchase, the sale shall comply with the limitations of RCW 53.08.091.

Section 4 Except as provided above, all sales made pursuant to this resolution shall be by public competitive sale, through open auction or sealed bids or in another commercially reasonable way (e.g. best offer after newspaper ad, Craigslist posting, eBay listing, etc.). The sale shall be advertised by the Executive Director at least fourteen (14) days prior to its occurrence.

<u>Section 5</u> Property having a value in excess of \$10,000.00 shall not be divided into components of less than \$10,000 and sold pursuant to this resolution, unless the sale is authorized by the Commission and is by public competitive bid.

Section 6 This resolution shall be in force for the 2017 calendar year and shall expire on December 31, 2017.

VIII. CELL PHONE POLICY

Effective Date: July 26, 2011

Approval Document: Resolution <u>7-2017</u>

PURPOSE

The Port of Skamania County (Port) hereby adopts a policy for the use of Port-owned cell phones and reimbursement for personal cell phones used for Port Business.

POLICY

This policy shall apply to all Port employees.

- 1. Cell phones are an important and necessary tool for certain employees to perform their job duties. For this purpose, the Commission will determine whether or not the Executive Director requires a Port-provided cell phone and whether or not a data plan is necessary. The Executive Director will be responsible for determining whether any employees require a Port-provided cost-effective cell phone and whether a data plan is needed.
- 2. An employee may make a request to the Executive Director to receive a cell phone reimbursement for use of their personal cell phone for Port related business. The Executive Director may make a similar request to the Commission. If approved, the Port will reimburse a maximum of \$40 for cell phone plans that do not utilize data and a maximum of \$60 for plans that do utilize data.
- 3. If an employee chooses a cell phone reimbursement over a Port-issued cell phone, the employee shall enter into a Cell Phone Contract with the Port, which must be active as long as a cell phone reimbursement is in place. (See Appendix 1: Cell Phone Reimbursement Contract) Port employees receiving a cell phone reimbursement are responsible for purchasing and maintaining the equipment and for payment of all bills and charges, to include accessories and taxes. Port employees should also be able to provide all billing statements as requested by the Port Executive Director or Finance Manager

PROCEDURE

- 1. Determination of Cell Phone Eligibility
 - a. Eligibility for either a Port-owned cell phone or a reimbursement for a personal cell phone is based on the need for frequent use of a cell phone as determined by the Executive Director and whether data service is advisable. If eligible, employees should submit a copy of their phone bill to the Finance Manager to determine the reimbursement rate.
 - b. Employees leaving Port employment must turn in Port-owned cell phones as part of their termination process. Employees transferring or promoting within the Port must reestablish their eligibility in their new position.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER DAMAGE

WHEREAS, beginning January 17, 2017 and continuing through January 19, 2017 the Port of Skamania County experienced excessive snow, freezing rain, and ice accumulations that created emergency conditions, and;

WHEREAS, trees have sustained severe damage on all Port owned property, buildings show signs of damage to include roof leaks and gas leaks, and Port tenants report difficulty in carrying out regular business as a result of ice and snow accumulations and/or property damage; and

WHEREAS, on January 19, 2017, in compliance with the Delegation of Authority Resolution No. 12-2008 adopted by the Commission on November 25, 2008, and Washington State statutes RCW 39.04.020, RCW 39.04.280, and RCW 53.08.120, the Executive Director of the Port of Skamania declared an emergency situation exists which presents a real, immediate threat to the proper performance of essential functions and will likely result in material loss and damage to property, bodily injury, or loss of life if immediate action is not taken, and;

WHEREAS, the Governor of Washington declared a state of emergency through Proclamation 17-01 dated January 13, 2017, due to severe winter storms and ice;

WHEREAS, repairs must be performed immediately, and the Executive Director waives the competitive bidding requirements and authorizes the award of all necessary contracts to address this emergency situation, and;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Port Commission does resolve as follows:

<u>Section1.</u> The Declaration of Emergency issued by the Executive Director on January 19, 2017 due to severe weather damage to Port buildings and property from the ice and wind storms on January 17, 18 and 19, 2017 is ratified.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Commission invokes the exception for competitive bidding per RCW 39.04.280 to waive the competitive bidding requirements and authorize the award of all necessary contracts to address this emergency situation.

<u>Section 3.</u> The declaration of emergency set forth in Section 1 shall terminate when the Executive Director determines there is no longer a threat to the health, welfare, or safety of individuals on Port property.

<u>Section 4.</u> The Port of Skamania County supports the City and County's decision to activate the Skamania County Comprehensive Emergency Plan and use of the emergency powers granted pursuant to that plan.

WHEREAS, the population of the Port District is less than 10,000;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY that the Board authorizes a regular property tax levy for 2018 of \$255,474.48, which is an increase of \$2,529.45 and 1 percent over the \$252,945.03 collected in 2017, plus an increase amount, resulting from the addition of new construction and improvements to property, of \$2,889.87, and an increase amount in the value of state assessed property of \$1,306.38.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE PORT OF SKAMANIA COUNTY PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF WARRANTS BEFORE APPROVAL BY THE COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, this Resolution supersedes and repeals all previous resolutions to include 2-2017 and 11-2017 regarding the Issuance of Warrants; and

WHEREAS, prior approval of the Port of Skamania County Board of Commissioners for the expenditure of funds for certain operating expenses and other purposes (claims) is frequently made necessary by Federal and State statutes, contractual agreements, and other requirements; and

WHEREAS, the prepayment of such claims is specifically authorized by RCW 42.24.180 subject to certain conditions; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Skamania County that prepayment of claims in the amount of \$950,000 is approved for the calendar year 2017, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The Executive Director and the Officer(s) designated to sign the warrants must have an official bond;
- 2. Contracting, hiring, purchasing, and disbursing policies that implement effective internal controls shall be maintained;
- 3. Documentation supporting claims paid and all checks issued in payment of claims shall be made available for review by the Port of Skamania County Board of Commissioners at its next regularly scheduled public meeting; and
- 4. If, upon review, the Port of Skamania County Board of Commissioners disapproves a paid claim, the Executive Director and/or other persons who signed the check shall jointly cause the disapproved claim to be recognized as a receivable of the Port and to pursue collection diligently until the amount disapproved is collected or until the Commission is satisfied and approves the claim.
